EACH COMPETITOR (THIS INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE RECORDED OWNER AND ALL TRAINERS, DRIVERS, RIDERS, HALTER HANDLERS, COACHES AND THE PERSON(S) SIGNING THE ENTRY BLANK) IN AN ARABIAN HORSE ASSOCIATION RECOGNIZED ARABIAN DIVISION, AT THE TIME OF ENTRY INTO A COMPETITION, MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF A VALID AHA MEMBERSHIP/COMPETITION CARD, JOIN AHA OR PAY AN AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP FEE PER COMPETITOR. WHEN AN AGENT SIGNS FOR THE OWNER AT AN AHA RECOGNIZED COMPETITION, BOTH THE OWNER AND AGENT MUST BE MEMBERS OF AHA OR PAY THE AHA SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP.

SINGLE EVENT MEMBERSHIP IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AT AHA REGIONAL OR NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS IN WALK-TROT CLASSES ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS AT QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS, BUT MUST HAVE AN AHA MEMBERSHIP WITH COMPETITION CARD AT AHA REGIONAL AND NATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS IN LEAD LINE CLASSES OR PARENTS/GUARDIANS SIGNING FOR MINORS ARE EXEMPT FROM AHA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. (BOD 5/12)

Equestrian Canada

- The PAWWSHA Sport Horse and Working Western competition is sanctioned as a Bronze competition of Equestrian Canada 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1)
- Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.5)
- Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)
- Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)

Statement of Principal

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction. EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horses.
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane. (A602.3(f))

The Rule Book

Exhibitors, Judges, and Show Officials are responsible for knowledge of the Rules. Both a complete knowledge of and compliance with the rules are essential, and all participants must be fully cognizant of all rules as well as class specifications in the division in which they compete. Full details of Horse Show operation – EC (including FEI) rules – list of recognized judges – **other vital information is in the Rule Book**. Copyright for exclusive use of recognized shows. See current EC Rules and Amendments. Every individual is eligible to count points won at recognized EC shows for Annual and Provincial Championship Awards. The current EC Rules and Amendments are presently in effect and have been used to compile the Rules and Regulations for this prize list. Passports are not required in a recognized BREED competition.

Bronze Licence is required for this competition.

Amateur Competitors: All seniors competing in EC amateur classes must possess a current amateur card. This must be applied for at the same time as the Competitive License. Membership to EC is now called a Competitive License. All exhibitors, owners, trainers, riders, drivers and handlers must join EC with a competitive license to be able to compete in any EC sanctioned show. **(B1302.b)**

PAWWSHA General Rules & Conditions

General Conditions

- The Agri-Park grounds are located on a quarter section of land due east of the Melville Regional Park and adjacent to #10 Highway, northeast of the City of Melville, along Agri-Park Road between Highways #10 and #15.
- There will not be a veterinarian, farrier, or ambulance on site. Emergency contact information is provided.
- Wash bays are available but are cold water only; judge will be aware of this.
- Coggins testing is not required.
- Patterns, show schedule, and individual ride times will be distributed to entrants no later than Thursday July 12th.
- Ribbons will be provided to 3rd place and placings to 6th place.
- Ribbons can be picked up with tests / score sheets on both Saturday and Sunday after the end of the class.
- High Point prizes will be presented after the completion of the show on Sunday afternoon.
- Camping on site is permitted (\$50 fee if plugin is required). The Howard Johnson Hotel has reduced rates for show exhibitors if booked by June 28th (call 306-728-4546).

Courtesy and Conduct

- Be respectful when moving in and out, especially when show is in progress.
- Competitors arriving on the show grounds must report to the show office to verify membership cards, confirm that all is in order with your entry forms and classes, pay any fees owing, and pick up your show numbers. For security reasons, we need to know which horses are on the grounds and ensure that we have the correct contact information.
- The show committee reserves the right to limit entries, combine or cancel classes, alter ring sizes, decide on any point not covered by the rules, and correct any errors or make any necessary changes to the prize list or program during the course of the competition year. Competitors will be notified at the earliest possible time of any changes. The onus will be upon the competitor to familiarize her/himself with such changes.
- There will be zero tolerance for abuse of horses, show officials, or fellow competitors.
- If at any time the Show Committee, Judge, Steward or executive of PAWWSHA feel that a horse is uncontrollable, that animal will be removed.
- Dogs must be leashed at all times and are not permitted in the warm-up ring or hitching area.
- In case of an injury to a spectator, athlete or horse, the announcer will call for an immediate halt in all rings. All stabled horses shall remain in that location until further notice, vehicle traffic is requested to refrain from moving.
- The Show Steward shall have full power to act for, and on behalf of the Show Committee during the entire show.

Entries

- **Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.**
- **When entering the show, competitors have the option of all classes listed. However, due to time constraints, the total number of patterns / tests / classes run will be limited (e.g., we will be able to run approximately 30 reining patterns, 35 dressage tests, and 25 triangles per day).**
- Once the show is full, a wait-list will be created.
- Entries will only be accepted by e-mail or mail. Phone or late entries will not be accepted.
- Every effort will be made to ensure horses and riders can compete in all classes entered without conflict (see scheduling section). If this is not possible, entrants will be contacted and refunds for classes not entered will be provided.
- All competitors are encouraged to enter as soon as possible to secure their spots. Entries submitted prior to May 30th may use the early-bird entry form which requires knowing the number of horses and classes entered within each division but does not require names of horses or specific classes. To be accepted, the early-bird form must be accompanied by a cheque for \$100 per horse. This cheque will be applied toward your entry fees but is not refundable if entries are cancelled. The show committee does not guarantee that entries will remain open until May 30th as it is possible some divisions may fill up earlier. All entries must submit the full entry form by June 30th, 2018. Failure to do so will void the early-bird entry and you will not be refunded.

- **The first 25 entries will receive a prize and ALL early-bird entries will be entered into a draw for a cash prize!**
- All entries must be accompanied by a hard copy Waiver of Liability signed by the appropriate person (athlete, owner, parent/guardian) and dated (if you entered via email, a hard copy must be signed at the show office on Friday). Parent or guardians must sign for junior exhibitors.
- More than one athlete may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing the horse/pony is not entered by two athletes in the same class. The athletes can both be juniors or open or any combination of these providing they are not in the same class unless the class is divided into separate categories for the purpose of ribbons. The horse/pony must not compete against itself. (See Article E 7.11.8)
- A Dressage horse may compete in any two, but only two consecutive levels and a maximum of four tests per day (See Article E 7.11.9).
- No child or adult may compete in a class in which horsemanship is a factor before a judge by whom said child or adult has been instructed, coached, or tutored with or without pay within 30 days of the date of competition. It is the responsibility of the athlete not to enter a class or ride in front of a judge from whom he/she has received instruction or a riding clinic in the previous 30 days. Any coach/trainer may not be judged by his/her student or owner of a horse they are training within 30 days of the coaching/training taking place. No child or adult may complete in a class where the judge who is officiating *or* the steward responsible for checking his/ her tack is a member of his/her immediate family. (See EC Dressage Rules Article E 7.0)
- PAWWSHA reserves the right to refuse entries (article A805 EC) and reserves the right to ask anyone to leave the premises without compensation in the event of disorderly conduct, as per Show Management and club executive.
- See current EC Arabian section B1502.6 for Achievement Levelling Program. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know the rules of each class/each division of each class he/she enters. Please read the information for this category.
- AHA entries can not be accepted without an up-to-date copy of the registration certificate.
- Late entries day of show will be allowed for rail classes if payment is received by show office at least one hour prior to scheduled start time of class. Only rail classes already scheduled to run may be entered late. Late entries day of show will not be allowed in any pattern/test classes.

Payments and Refunds

- All entries must be accompanied by a cheque (made out to Prairie Arabian Working Western and Sport Horse Association), or cash for the appropriate fees. Early-bird fees will be deposited on Monday June 4th and regular entry fees will be deposited on Monday July 9th.
- **Nobody will participate in the show unless entries are paid in full.**
- There will be a \$10 administration fee for substituting a horse and/or athlete show entry after June 30th. All appropriate waivers must be signed and memberships in place. (Article 7.11.10)
- In the event that the show is cancelled prior to June 30th (e.g., insufficient entries), no cheques will be cashed.
- In the event that the show or a portion thereof is cancelled prior to July 15th (e.g., extreme weather conditions), full refunds will be provided for classes not completed.
- Refunds will be considered upon receipt of a suitable veterinarian certificate attesting to the illness or injury within seven (7) days after the occurrence of said illness or injury and received by the show chair prior to the start of the show. All granted refunds will be sent out by mail after the close of the show and will be made payable to the owner of the horse.
- Upon receipt of a returned cheque for non-sufficient funds, a \$50 charge will be levied if paid within 30 days. After 30 days, a \$100 charge will be levied. If after 45 days the returned cheque has not been replaced, the Show Committee has the option to report the payee to AHA and EC for suspension and/or to impose further action for future shows.
- Early-bird exhibitors cancelling entries after May 30th will forfeit all fees paid.
- Exhibitors canceling entries after the closing date of June 30th, 2018 for any reason without veterinarian certificate shall forfeit ALL fees.

Memberships

- All membership cards must be presented at the show office upon arrival to validate your entries. If you do not have your proof or membership, you will not be allowed to show without purchasing the appropriate temporary membership(s). No refunds will be provided if you choose not to compete day of show due to lack of membership.
- All entries must have an Equestrian Canada membership AND membership from a provincial sport governing body (e.g., SHF, MHC, or AEF). To apply for an Equestrian Canada Bronze Level membership go to <https://www.equestrian.ca/programs-services/licences> to apply online.
- SHF membership is required to compete in Heritage Circuit classes.
- AHA membership is required to compete in any AHA recognized classes (registered Arabians, Half-Arabians, and Anglo-Arabians only). This includes at least one recorder owner at the time of entry and all trainers, riders, handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry blank.

Stabling

- Stabling is outdoors and limited, please consider sharing a tack stall if possible.
- All horses must be stalled and there is a limit of one horse per stall. A mandatory stabling fee will be charged per horse. It is prohibited to tie a horse to a trailer.
- Move in time no earlier than 12:00pm Friday July 13th.
- Horses may be removed from the show grounds after they have completed competition for the day, however the mandatory stabling fee will still be charged for each horse that competes. Once the horse has completed its last class, it may leave the show grounds.

Scheduling and Wait-Lists

- Sport Horse and Working Western rings will run concurrently both days.
- **All classes will run using ride-time scheduling.** Scheduling will be dependent on entries and thus will occur once the show has filled or after the entry closing date (whichever occurs first).
- All competitors must be ready in the hitching ring at their ride time; failure to do so may result in automatic scratching of the class. If the show is running early, you are not required to enter the ring prior to your posted ride time but may choose to do so.
- Schedules will be distributed no later than Thursday July 12th.
- **Tentative** schedule of divisions is as follows. This may vary pending entries.

 * Actual time-frames will depend on entries, final schedule and ride times will be provided to all competitors no later than Thursday July 12th

- **Every effort will be made to accommodate horses and riders who are showing in both rings.** In cases where this is not possible, competitors will be contacted and may need to scratch one of the conflicting classes but will be reimbursed.
- In the event of a wait-list, the show committee has the right to combine rail classes pending entries.
- We expect to start around 7 AM on both Saturday and Sunday and continue until completion of the classes. Your class may be scheduled any time Saturday or Sunday but horses will not compete in more than four classes within one division in one day, except for in hand classes.
- In the event of changes to the schedule (due to scratches or lack of participants), day sheets will be posted daily in the morning of competition. These sheets will inform all competitors of the most current and correct order of go and will override previous scheduling. It is the competitor's responsibility to check for any possible changes.

Warming-up

- Use of shared warm up area is free of charge for all competitors at all times.
- **No riders will be allowed to warm-up in or around the competition ring without purchasing a warm-up block of time.**
- **Paid warm-up times:**
 - Paid warm-up times will be offered on Friday for the Dressage ring, Reining/Ranch Riding/Western Riding arena, Trail course, and Sport Horse Triangle. EXCEPTION: those showing in SHF Heritage Trail may not purchase a Trail warm-up slot as they are prohibited from using the show's equipment for practicing before the class or event begins, on penalty of disqualification. (SHF #12)
 - Blocks of time may be purchased at \$10/10 minutes for warm-up in each competition ring on Friday. Payment must be included with entries.
 - Time slots may only be purchased by a single rider. Riders may choose to combine time slots in order to ride as a group, but each rider must purchase at least one time slot (e.g., 3 riders may ride for 30 minutes as long as each purchases a time slot; 1 rider may also purchase three time slots and ride alone for 30 minutes).
 - All horse/riders must be registered with the competition to be eligible for a warm-up time.
 - All Warm-up requests will be scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis.
 - Warm-up Schedule will be shared with all competitors no later than Wednesday July 11th.
 - Ranch riding and western riding patterns will not be set up during paid warm-ups slots but pylons will be provided if riders wish to do so within their 10 minutes.
- Horses may be schooled only in the designated areas. Schooling of horses may only be done by EC Sport License holders (see Article E 7.11.12).
- To avoid disrupting the warm-up of other competitors, the Show Committee requests that the shared warm-up ring not be used for test calling.
- Lungeing is not permitted in any area where horses are being ridden (see EC Dressage Rules E 7.16).
- Lungeing and work in hand (unmounted) may only be done by the athlete, owner, coach, groom or Person Responsible and must be under the supervision of a steward.
- Show numbers must be visible on horse or rider/handler during warm-up and any time horse is out of its stall.

Protests and Complaints

- A protest at an EC sanctioned competition, other than those specific matters covered in discipline/breed sport rules, must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an EC Sport License holder (i.e. owner, lessee, trainer, coach, official, competitor or authorized agent) or by any person listed in A212 (Exemptions from Sport Licenses) in the division in which the question arises; b) a Protest must be made in writing and addressed to the secretary of the OC at the event which the matter under consideration occurs. Every Protest must be signed and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash. (Note that protesting a horse's height also carries a \$100 cash deposit). For full details see Article A 1204 General Regulations. The soundness of a horse, when determined by an official veterinarian of the competition, or by a judge, is not subject to protest. (Article A1202).

- A Member may file a Complaint within 21 days of the date on which the alleged breach of the EC rule or policy occurred. All Complaints regarding a Dispute shall be sent directly to the President of EC or his/her designate, together with the required deposit (as per the Schedule of Fines and Penalties) and a brief summary, in writing, of the reasons and circumstances of the Dispute. For full details see Article A 1209 General Regulations.

Liability

- All entries are accepted with the understanding that the Arabian Horse Association, Equestrian Canada, PAWWSHA, its officers, contract personnel or volunteers or any of its affiliates, the Melville Agri Park, their officers, officials and employees will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury, to any exhibitor, his or her agent or employee, or to any horse or any article of any kind. The exhibitor will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury, to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, his agents or employees, or by any animal owned or exhibited by him and shall indemnify all parties above against any land loss, damages, or liability thus occasioned, including but not limited to any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof. The submitting of any entry form to the Entry Secretary shall constitute and acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.

Protective Headgear

- **All Dressage riders (english and western) must wear protective headgear:** All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. (See Glossary – Headgear Standards; see Article E 4.0; See article A905 General Rules EC).
- **All Junior riders must wear protective headgear:** All juniors will wear properly fitted and fastened approved headgear at all times while riding or driving at the event location. It is understood that juniors not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete in the Heritage classes at these competitions.
- By the breed exemption Rule – B1306.7, adult riders competing in AHA Working Western events may wear a western hat instead of helmet; however, use of helmets is strongly encouraged.
- Any competitor may wear approved protective headgear and/or a protective safety vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport in any division or class without penalty from the judge.

Dressage Specific Rules

- All Dressage classes will use Equestrian Canada tests; All AHA Western Dressage classes will use Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA) tests, and all SHF Heritage Western Dressage classes will use Western Style Dressage Association of Canada (WSDAC) tests.
- All tests may be called during the competition, limited to reading the movement a maximum of twice without adding anything else which might assist the athlete. Callers may not wear personal electronic devices while calling tests.
- Scorings and Placings: All scores in dressage tests will now be calculated to the third decimal.
- Any horse receiving less than 40% in a test will be eliminated. Any horse receiving less than 50% in a test will not be eligible for ribbons, prizes, etc.
- When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons will be awarded with the following percentages: First 60% or higher / Second 57% to 59.9% / Third 54% to 56.9%.

Other Rules

- All horses brought onto show grounds must be entered in at least one class.
- Drug fees are mandatory for Equestrian Canada competitions and must be included with entry fees. For rules governing equine Medications, please see Rules of Equestrian Canada, General Regulations, Chapter 10 (Equine medication Control) AND Dressage Rules, Chapter 16 (Equine Medications). Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (Article A602.5). Athletes are also subject to the Medication Control rules set by Sport Canada and may be tested.

- Numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the warm-up, schooling and/or exercise areas as well as in the competition rings, whether the horse is under saddle or not. (Article E 7.11.2 and E 7.11.3). Any Exhibitor using the wrong number or having no number *may* be excused or disqualified from the class at the discretion of the Judge.
- **Stallions may not be shown by juniors.**
- Obvious sideline coaching or obvious ringside assistance while rider is being judged may result in the disqualification of the exhibitor. (SHF#18)
- No Hors concours allowed.
- Participants are requested to read carefully all rules governing this show. Competition rules will follow the Saskatchewan Horse Federation and Equestrian Canada Rule books for all classes.
- No person other than the officials, steward, attendants on duty, and the judge of the class may enter the show ring without permission of the judge.
- If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made, or caused to be made, any false statements in regards to any animal or article exhibited or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the judge in performance of his/her duties, they shall be excluded from competing or exhibiting.
- Due to unforeseeable problems with any mechanical device, the public address system and paddock calls over that system must be considered a courtesy. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be sure that their horse is at the gate at the prescribed time. Every effort will be made to maintain a working public address system to carry class calls, however, no protest will be upheld, nor will any section or class be changed on the basis of the public address system malfunctions.

Definitions

Amateur - A rider who holds a current Amateur card from Equestrian Canada. To hold an Amateur card, one must not accept remuneration for coaching, training, or riding a horse. Amateur classes are judged on manners, performance, suitability as a sport horse, conformation, quality. An Amateur may NOT show a horse that is a client of any member of their immediate family unless they are a Junior (under the age of 19 as of December 1st).

Arabian - any purebred Arabian Horse registered with the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry or Arabian Horse Association (registration number is required at entry).

Choice (Amateur) - Has not received more than 250 AHA Achievement points or has not levelled out of the National Choice Amateur Level. Riders who are deemed Choice by their leveling points may not level down to Select.

Choice (Open) - Has not received more than 250 AHA Achievement points or has not levelled out of the National Choice Open Level. Riders who are deemed Choice by their leveling points may not level down to Select.

Choice (Youth) - Has not received more than 300 AHA Achievement points or has not levelled out of the National Choice Youth Level. Riders who are deemed Choice by their leveling points may not level down to Select.

- Dressage type** - Horses of this type carry a higher set-on neck than the Hunter type with sufficient length and flexion of the poll. Movement should be free, elastic, active and regular with good push from behind without tension and with a tendency toward an uphill balance.
- Elite (Amateur)** - Has not received more than 250 AHA Achievement points. Elite riders may not level down to Choice or Select.
- Elite (Open)** - Has not received more than 250 AHA Achievement points. Elite riders may not level down to Choice or Select.
- Elite (Youth)** - Has not received more than 300 AHA Achievement points. Elite riders may not level down to Choice or Select.
- Half-Arabian / Anglo-Arabian** - Any Horse registered with the Canadian Partbred Registry or the Arabian Horse Association with one purebred Arabian parent (registration number is required at entry).
- Hunter type** - Horses of this type carry a more level frame than the Dressage type horse, yet must display a natural looking carriage. Movement should have good ground cover and tend to be long and low with good push from behind, free of tension and showing good balance.
- Junior A** - 15 - 17 years as of January 1st (SHF Heritage classes)
- Junior B** - 11 - 14 years as of January 1st (SHF Heritage classes)
- Junior C** - 11 years and under as of January 1st (SHF Heritage classes)
- Junior Rider** - 18 years as of December 31st, 2018 (AHA classes) -
- Junior Horse** - A horse aged 5 or under. Junior horse classes are judged on quality, suitability for the discipline, performance (purity and quality of gaits), conformation and manners. Junior horses may be ridden with a snaffle bit or bosal with two hands on the reins in all classes.
- Limit Horse** - Horses who have not won six first place ribbons in the particular performance class in which they are shown. A Novice entry is such until the closing date of entries.
- Maiden Horse** - Horses who have not received one first place ribbon in the particular performance class in which they are shown. A Maiden entry is such until the closing date of entries.
- Novice Horse** - Horses who have not won three first place ribbons in the particular performance class in which they are shown. A Novice entry is such until the closing date of entries.
- Open** - Classes with no limitations on rider or horse based on age, ability, amateur status, etc. These classes are judged on performance (purity and quality of gaits), manners, conformation, and, quality.
- Open breed** - Classes that are open to any breed of horse, including un-registered or grade horses. Arabians and Half-Arabians may cross-enter into open breed classes.
- Person Responsible** - The Person Responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The PR must hold an EC membership and shall be either the trainer, owner, rider, or a parent/guardian of the junior competitor.
- Select (Amateur)** - Has not received more than 100 AHA Achievement points or has not levelled out of the National Select Amateur Level.
- Select (Open)** - Has not received more than 100 AHA Achievement points or has not levelled out of the National Select Open Level.
- Select (Youth)** - Has not received more than 150 AHA Achievement points or has not levelled out of the National Select Youth Level.
- Senior** - 18 years and over as of January 1st.
- Sport Horse** - a section developed to evaluate and encourage the breeding of horses suitable for Dressage, Working Hunter, Jumper, Carriage Driving, Combined Training/Eventing, Distance Riding and Racing

Description of Classes

Our goal at the PAWWSHA Beat the Heat show is for everyone to have fun and try something new!

Have you always wanted to try trail obstacles? Wondered what Dressage is? Curious how your horse would score in a conformation class? This is your opportunity to give it a try!

What is Dressage?

In Dressage, you will demonstrate your horse's movement, relaxation, and obedience by performing certain maneuvers in the form of tests. All tests can be read aloud to riders during competition and are available online to practice at home. Dressage is shown at specific levels and may be ridden Western or English depending on the class. In Western Dressage, two hands and snaffle bits are permitted regardless of horse's age.

In Walk-Trot Level (English) and Introductory Level (Western), required movements are medium walk, free walk, and rising trot / jog. All work is performed on 20 m circles and straight lines. In Training Level (English) and Basic Level (Western), the required movements are medium walk, free walk, working trot/jog, free trot/job, and canter/lope. All work is performed on 20 m circles, straight lines, and loops. In First Level, horses are required to show lengthening of trot and canter, and display balance on smaller circles.

A horse may enter only two consecutive levels at any show and must not complete more than 4 tests in one day.

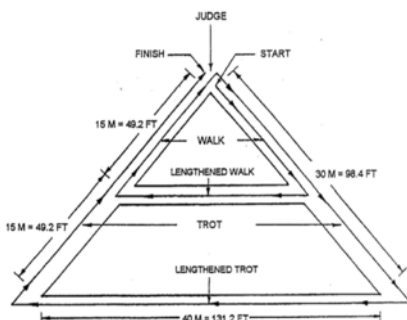

What is Sport Horse in Hand?

In a Sport Horse in Hand (SHIH) class, your horse's conformation is evaluated in terms of potential trainability, potential performance and predisposition to soundness. Form to function is emphasized. Blemishes are not to count unless resulting from conformation faults. Gaits are to be evaluated in terms of purity, quality and correctness. Correct gaits which contribute to ease in training and the horse remaining sound and useable are most important.

Horses are shown on the triangle and are scored individually. You will first present your horse to the judge at the point of the triangle. When the judge is ready, you will walk your horse around the small triangle and then trot around the large triangle. You will then present your horse again and leave the arena when asked.

One handler may show multiple horses within the same class. Horses over 3 years old must show in a dressage or hunter type bridle. Horses aged two years may be shown in a bridle (as listed above), or a plain leather stable halter. Horses under age two years must be shown in a plain leather stable halter. Conservative casual attire is recommended for the handler.

What is Sport Horse Under Saddle?

At our show, Sport Horse Under Saddle (SHUS) classes includes Arabian SHUS classes as well as SHF Road Hack and English Pleasure classes. All are group classes judged on the rail. There are no score sheets, horses are judged in comparison to others in the ring. These classes should take no more than 10-12 minutes to judge. Riders and horses may cross enter between all classes.

SHUS: Horses will be judged at the walk, trot, and canter, both directions. You may be asked for a lengthening of stride at any gait and/or to rein-back while lined up. You will not be asked to hand gallop. Snaffle bits must be used.

Road Hack: The most important judging criteria is PERFORMANCE which makes up 55% of the score followed by substance at 20%, conformation 15%, and manners 10%. Horses will be judged at the walk, trot, canter, and Hand Gallop in both directions. A strong trot may be asked for.

What is Show Hack?

Sport Horse Show Hack classes are for the well-trained athlete. It is a group class judged on the rail. There are no score sheets, horses are judged in comparison to others in the ring. These classes should take no more than 15 minutes to judge. Horses will be shown at a walk, trot, and canter with collected, normal, and extended gaits to be called for each. Horses will also be asked to hand gallop. All gaits are required to be performed both ways of the ring. Horses must also stand quietly and back readily. Double bridles are permitted but not required. In SHF Show Hack classes, the collected and extended walk will not be asked for.

What is English Equitation, Reining Seat Equitation, and Western Horsemanship?

In equitation and horsemanship classes, riders are judged on their seat, hands, legs, and their ability to control and show their horse. The horse is not judged. All horses entered in the class will proceed at least once around the ring at each gait – walk, jog/trot and lope/canter – and on command will reverse and repeat. Following the rail work, the class will line up and perform individual patterns at the judge's discretion. These patterns may include: rein back, figure 8 at a trot, demonstrating change of diagonals, figure 8 at a canter with a simple lead change through trot, extended trot or medium trot, turn on the haunches, change of leads on a straight line down the center line with a simple change, or counter canter.

What is Reining?

To rein a horse is not only to guide it, but also to control its every movement. Desired qualities possessed by a good reining horse are smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness and authority in performing the various reining maneuvers. These maneuvers include: loping at speed, roll backs, sliding stops, lead changes, spins, large fast and small slow circles.

Each contestant will perform the required pattern individually and separately. All horses will be judged immediately upon entering the arena, and judging will cease after the last maneuver. All riders must drop the bridle immediately after the performance to be checked by the steward. Scoring will be on the basis of 0 - Infinity, with 70 denoting an average performance. There is no restriction on the number of horses a rider may show in a class.

What is Ranch Riding?

The purpose of Ranch Horse Riding should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse working outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. Light contact should be rewarded and horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. Each horse will individually complete a pattern which is scored from 0 to 100 with an average score of 70. Horses will receive +1 1/2 to -1 1/2 per maneuver, with 0 indicating average performance. There is no time limit.

Patterns may include walk, jog/trot, extended trot, lope, extended lope, lead changes, 360 turns, and walk or job over poles. In all gaits, movement of the Ranch Riding horse should simulate a horse needing to cover long distances, softly and quietly, like that of a working ranch horse, while maintaining a bright, attentive expression. Transitions should be performed where designated, with smoothness and responsiveness.

What is Trail?

The Trail Horse Class is the performance of a safe, sensible, well-mannered horse over a course of obstacles. Competitors will be given their pattern at the show. At least six obstacles will be used, three of which will be mandatory (Gate, backing obstacle, and logs or poles) and at least three others selected from the approved list (e.g., Optional Obstacles may include: Serpentine obstacles, rubber stall mats, wooden bridge, carrying an object from one part of arena to another, side pass over poles, 360 turns within a square, etc.).

In Hand Trail is performed with the horse in hand. Suitable halter (Leather preferred) to be used with leather lead (with or without a chain) to be used. If a chain is used with the lead it must not be run through the horse's mouth or over the horse's nose. No crop, whip, chaps, chinks or spurs allowed. Judges should consider the overall appearance of the horse, conditioning, grooming, and the equipment in the overall score. Also to be considered is the correctness of the horse while being led. For safety reasons, those handlers continuously holding the chain on the lead, tightly coiling the lead shank around the hand, or dragging the lead shank must be penalized. Patterns will include a walk and jog of suitable duration to determine the way of going.

English Trail is performed in English tack while Western Trail is performed in Western tack. In both, the gait between the obstacles shall be at the discretion of the judge but horses are required to show the three gaits (walk, jog/trot and lope/canter) somewhere between obstacles (except in the walk/trot class) as a part of its work and will be scored as a maneuvers. A flying lead change cannot be required, but it can be optional.

Scoring will be on the basis of 0 - infinity, with 70 denoting an average performance. Each obstacle will be scored from +11/2 to minus 11/2. Obstacle scores are to be determined and assessed independently of penalty points (e.g., blatant disobedience, refusal, etc.). Failure to follow the course shall cause elimination. Failure to complete each maneuver shall not be elimination, but is penalized.

The amateur and junior (horse and rider) Trail classes at this show will be beginner friendly!

What is Western Riding?

Western Riding is an event where the horse is judged on quality of gaits, lead changes at the lope, response to the rider, manners and disposition. The horse should perform with reasonable speed, and be sensible, well-mannered, free and easy moving.

One of three possible patterns will be individually performed (patterns can be viewed here: <https://www.saskhorse.ca/Download/Competitions/HeritageCircuit/ShowOrganizers/2017-CHANGES-VISIBLE-Heritage-PC-Handbook.pdf>)

Horses may be ridden with light contact or on a reasonably loose rein. The horse should cross the log both at the jog and the lope without breaking gait or radically changing stride. Except for junior horses shown with a hackamore or snaffle, only one hand must be used and not be changed, except that it is permissible to change hands when opening gate if the gate is in such a position as to justify the change of hands on the reins.

The pattern is scored from 0 to 100, with 70 denoting the average score, and add or subtract points for performance or faults.

What is Western Suitability Halter?

In the Western Suitability Halter class, your horse's conformation is evaluated in terms of potential trainability, potential performance in western disciplines, and predisposition to soundness. Form to function is emphasized. Blemishes are not to count unless resulting from conformation faults. Gaits are to be evaluated in terms of purity, quality and correctness. Correct gaits which contribute to ease in training and the horse remaining sound and useable are most important.

Horses are shown in a group and placed comparatively. You will enter the arena at a jog counter-clockwise and set your horse up along the rail. When asked, each handler will walk their horse to the judge and present for inspection. You will then trot away from the judge and return to the rail. Horses are to be shown in a plain, clean halter; leather preferred but not mandatory. Conservative casual attire is recommended for the handler.

What is Showmanship?

The Showmanship class shall be judged strictly on the exhibitor's ability to fit and show a horse at halter. The horse is merely a prop to demonstrate the ability and preparation of the exhibitor. The ideal showmanship performance consists of a poised, confident, neatly attired exhibitor leading a well-groomed and conditioned horse that quickly and efficiently performs the requested pattern with promptness, smoothness, and precision. Showmanship patterns will be posted at the show. Competitors may be dressed in either Western or English attire. If in English attire, horse may be in either bridle or halter.

What is Leadline and costume?

Lead-line and costume classes at this show are a chance to demonstrate your creativity! Both classes will be judged at a walk only and are open to any ages. Leaders must be at least 14 years old. Horses entered in the costume class may be lead, ridden, or both. Costumes must be safe.

Nominated riders are eligible to earn points from placings in Heritage classes and these points will count towards year end awards. Please ensure your SHF membership is current and that you have nominated if you are interested in accumulating points for the awards. To qualify for Heritage Provincial Finals, you must attend a minimum of two Heritage shows and have placed in the top 5 in a division to be eligible. Horse/rider pairs must be nominated for the Heritage Circuit prior to this show in order for their points to be considered. These awards are given at the end of the year by SHF. AHA Achievement Award Points

PAWWSHA High Point Award Points

PAWWSHA members are eligible for High Point awards (the rider and at least one owner must be members). Horses and riders will accumulate PAWWSHA Points for each class that they enter. Horses may accumulate points with multiple riders and/or handlers; riders may accumulate points with multiple horses. Awards will be given in the following categories:

High Point Versatility Horse - Horse must compete in at least four divisions, one of which must be SH, one of which must be WW, and one of which must be either Sport Horse in Hand or Western Suitability Halter.

High Point Sport Horse - Horse must compete in at least two SH divisions and at least three classes.

High Point Working Western Horse - Horse must compete in at least two WW divisions and at least three classes.

High Point Junior Horse - Horse must be 5 years or under.

High Point Junior Rider / Handler - Rider / handler must be 18 years or younger as of December 31st, 2018.

Emergency Procedure / Disaster Plan

1. Do Not Move the Patient.
2. Notify the Show office by telephone or radio, who will then notify medical personnel and Show Management.
3. Medical personnel will evaluate patient and determine status.
4. Catch the horse (if applicable)
5. Advise the show office by Radio - Show office will call 911. Exhibitors are asked NOT to use their cell phones as the area code affects the directions.
6. Announcer will ask exhibitors to clear the area then Ringmaster, Steward or Show Management will help keep spectators back.
7. Show Personnel will keep the road clear so ambulance can get through without hurting anyone else.
8. A member of Show Personnel should be at front entrance to meet the ambulance Ask them to turn off their siren and escort them to the scene of the accident. (Ambulance sirens could spook a horse and cause additional accidents)
9. Accident forms will be completed by the Show Steward from Equestrian Canada.

For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions, the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. For junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions, the junior competitor cannot be the PR. For junior entries, the PR may be either the trainer, the owners of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the junior competitor.
